Orange Class had a great day celebrating World Book Day! The children all looked super in their costumes and we enjoyed a class fashion show. They worked very hard to write amazing character descriptions of Tinkerbell, then edited and improved them before writing out their final version in their best handwriting ready for you to see at the upcoming parent consultations. As well as geometry, Orange class are learning all about money in maths, adding together amounts and finding change. The children are enjoying learning about Pilgrimages in RE, comparing pilgrimages in different religions and considering where their own quiet place is to reflect.

Yellow Class have been working very hard. They were all very excited to show off their World Book Day costumes last week. We listened to a range of stories from the World Book Day website, spoke about book characters and wrote character descriptions about Captain Hook. These descriptions were then shared with other classes. This week they have made great progress with their sewing in DT and in art we have made clay pots. In geography, we have learnt the names of the countries and capital cities in the UK, found these in an atlas and learnt facts about these different places. In maths, we have moved on to learn about fractions.

Purple Class have been working hard on their writing recently. We have been reading and learning from non-chronological reports about space. This week, we practiced using conjunctions to compare and contrast in order to write a paragraph comparing Mercury and Venus. We are also developing our editing skills so that we correct and improve our writing. In maths, we have been learning about factors, square and cube numbers and prime numbers. In Science this week, we learnt about the order of the planets in our solar system and their distances from the sun. We went outside and used toilet paper rolls and spherical objects to find these distances. The distance of some planets from the sun was so far we ran out of toilet paper! In Art, we used our photographs of still life to create our own still life pictures using pastels. These look great; well done Purple Class!

Red Class have been writing some super sentences independently all about their World Book Day character. They had great fun dressing up last week and talking about their chosen books!

In Maths, they have been measuring length and height using cubes. They have been learning to predict how long an object might be before measuring to check. They have also been making some fantastic houses for the Three Little Pigs and drawing maps of Little Red Riding Hood's journey and adding labels.

In Blue Class we have been writing instructions on How to catch a Star. There has been lots of great ideas. In maths we have been adding and subtracting 1 and 2 digit numbers. In art we have been creating our own planets and using materials and other collage pieces to create a 3D effect.

This half term seems to be flying by very quickly! We all very much enjoyed dressing up for World book day and had a record breaking ten Harry Potter's in Green Class! The day tied in nicely with the class finishing off writing and illustrating their own picture book stories. There was so much to these that we have found it very challenging to get all the illustrations drawn! It's hard work being an author and illustrator! We've also been finding out more about the Romans and finding out what an impact they've had on modern day Britain. We're just about to discover why all roads lead to Rome... watch this space!

World Book Day costumes were fantastic this year. It was excellent to see so many Year 6 pupils put a huge amount of effort into their costumes. Thank you parents/carers for supporting them with this. This week, Silver Class visited Kettle's Yard. They explored Jim's house, sketched and used clay all under the close eye of some artists from the venue. They were a credit to the school: staff at Kettle's Yard commented on how well behaved and engaged they were, asking sensible and thoughtful questions throughout the day and producing some excellent work. Well done Silver Class. I think this means we have filled the pebble jar and will organise our treat next week! I wonder what it will be this time. In school, they have been learning about the punishments that Guy Fawkes received and how the evidence from a range of sources can help us understand what type of punishments must have occurred during the Victorian era. They have also designed their CAMs toys which they will build next term. Details about donations and lots of adult help (please!) will be coming out shortly. Overall, a very successful couple of weeks.
