Red Class Home Learning Summer Term 1: Where do they live?

Daily / Weekly

- **Reading:** Please share a book with your child each day and talk about what happened in the story. Record book title in your child's reading record book.
- **Phonics**: Practise phase 3 and phase 4 sounds. This includes reading and writing words containing the sounds. (See school website for resources and links to Little Wandle)
- **Writing:** Write high frequency words in a simple sentence. Remember to use a capital letter at the start, finger spaces between words and a full stop at the end of a sentence.
- **Maths**: Develop understanding of addition and subtracting for numbers up to 20 and be able to give an explanation and reason for their answer.

Topic related activities

These can be uploaded on Seesaw any time before **22**nd **May** and will be shared regularly in class via seesaw.

We would like you to complete at least 3 of these (but you can do more!) A record is kept of home learning.

- Go on a minibeast hunt. Go outside and see what you can find. Look under logs, in bushes and near plant pots. See if you can find ladybirds, woodlouse, snails, slugs, spiders etc... Take pictures of draw what you find.
- Create a fact file for an animal of your choice. Pick and animal and write about what it looks like, where it lives, what it eats and what makes it unique.
- Make a home for a creature. Use resources such as junk modelling, cotton wool, shredded paper, to make a home for a creature of your choice.
- Research animals and their habitats. Where in the world do they live? What temperatures do they like? This could be presented with pictures and labels or could be shared orally with the class.
- Find out how to look after a pet. What do you need to do to look after a fish/hamster/cat/dog? Make a poster to show others how to care for a pet.
- Visit the library and look at some books about animals. Share some interesting facts with us!
- Learn some songs with animals in. Old MacDonald, Alice the camel, Baby shark, The lion sleeps tonight, and many more!
